Senegal COVID-19 Information

All airline passengers to the United States ages two years and older, regardless of vaccination status or citizenship, must provide a negative COVID-19 viral test taken within one calendar day of travel. Alternatively, travelers to the United States may provide documentation from a licensed health care provider of having recovered from COVID-19 in the 90 days preceding travel. Exemptions will be considered on an extremely limited basis. Please contact your nearest embassy or consulate to apply for an exemption. Please visit the CDC webpages for more information about exemptions and the requirement for proof of negative COVID-19 test or recovery from COVID-19 for all air passengers arriving in the United States. ***

Country-Specific Information

- The Government of Senegal encourages individuals who believe they may be ill to seek care early, and encourages everyone to be vaccinated against COVID-19. The government also encourages individuals to avoid all gatherings and travel. Use of facial coverings is mandatory in public places and in private places receiving the public.

- Restaurants, casinos, places of worship, private beaches, sporting events and markets are permitted to operate while maintaining social distancing measures and facial coverings. Violators of facial covering requirements face possible detention and fines imposed by law enforcement officials.
- Public transportation services (taxis, care rapides and intercity buses) may transport the maximum number of passengers, provided all passengers wear a mask. Violators of facial covering requirements face possible detention and fines imposed by law enforcement officials.
- The U.S. Embassy encourages all U.S. citizens intending to travel to Senegal to contact their airline in advance of travel for additional information and register for <u>S.T.E.P.</u> (Smart Traveler Enrollment Program) for the latest updates.

AstraZeneca, Pfizer, and Johnson & Johnson vaccines received through the <u>COVAX program</u>. Please check with your local health clinic to see which vaccines are available at that location.

- The Government of Senegal has made vaccines available to all through local health clinics free of charge to anyone in the target population of adults aged 18 and older. Individuals must present a valid ID (National ID card, driver's license, passport, etc). Public hospitals in Dakar are also distributing vaccines. Vaccination hours are Monday through Saturday from 9am to 3pm.
- Senegal's target population eligible for COVID-19 vaccines includes all individuals 18 and up. Children 12 and up are eligible to be vaccinated if they have a documented medical comorbidity or other medical need as documented by a medical professional. Third "booster" vaccine doses are available beginning six months after the individuals last COVID-19 vaccine was administered.

- The United States Government does not plan to provide COVID-19 vaccinations to private U.S. citizens overseas. Please follow host country developments and guidelines for COVID-19 vaccination.

Entry and Exit Requirements

- Are U.S. citizens permitted to enter? Yes
- Is a negative COVID-19 test (PCR and/or serology) required for entry? Yes unless fully vaccinated
 - All travelers to Senegal over the age of two years must present either a:
 - COVID-19 vaccination certificate with a QR code showing that they were fully vaccinated with AstraZeneca (SK Bioscience or Vaxzevria), Covishield, Janssen J&J, Moderna, Pfizer-BioNTech, Sinovac, or Sinopharm at least 14 days before departure; or
 - A negative COVID-19 PCR or RT-PCR test result issued at most 72 hours before departure. The test result must be in English or French.
- Verification of testing compliance will be undertaken by the airline prior to departure. Passengers without acceptable proof of vaccination or a negative COVID-19 PCR test result may not be permitted to board.
- Are health screening procedures in place at airports and other ports of entry? Yes. Testing must be obtained within 72 hours in advance of departure to Senegal. Travelers arriving without valid testing or proof of vaccination may be subject to testing and/or quarantine on arrival
- Vaccination proof that does not have a QR code will not be accepted. Such travelers must present a negative COVID-19 PCR or RT-PCR test result issued at most 72 hours prior to departure.

Movement Restrictions

- Is a curfew in place? *No*
- Are there restrictions on intercity or interstate travel? No
- Land borders with The Gambia are open for routine travel, but all others remain open only for commercial transport. Individuals must present a negative COVID-19 test to cross at all land borders.

Quarantine Information

- Are U.S. citizens required to quarantine? No
 - All travelers to Senegal may be required to complete a passenger location form for public health officials, in accordance with recommendations from the International Civil Aviation Organization. The form will be collected on arrival.

Transportation Options

- Are commercial flights operating? Yes
- Is public transportation operating? Yes
 - Use of facial covering is required on public transportation, including taxis.
- Violators of Senegal's COVID-19 restrictions may incur fines or be detained by law enforcement officials.

Consular Operations

- The U.S. Embassy in Dakar accepts passport and Consular Report of Birth Abroad (CRBA) applications, emergency passport applications and provides notarial services. Notarial service and passport appointments can be scheduled online here. To request an emergency passport or CRBA appointment, please email DakarACS@state.gov. All application, fee and documentation requirements apply. See the Embassy website for additional details.
- Entrants to the U.S. Embassy are subject to COVID-related rules and precautions. If you do not feel well, please wait to request an appointment.
