

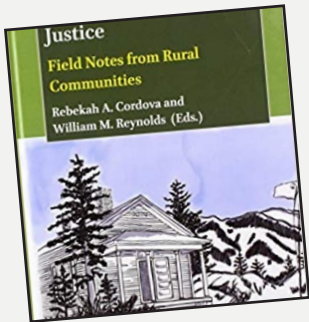
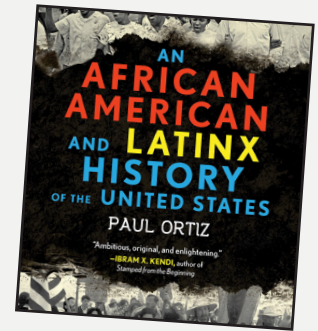
# THE FREEDOM SCHOOL PROJECT PRESENTS A VIRTUAL ZOOM PANEL DISCUSSION:
